1 in 5 EU 15-year-olds have poor reading skills

12,8 % of EU students drop out of school

30 % decrease of low skilled jobs until 2020





- Boys' reading time cut in half in five years
- 1 of 5 boys don't understand the text in a daily newspaper
- 1 of 3 teachers under 40 years old read 2 books per year at the most








Why focus on reading?


